
Chosen and Loved

"Peter, an apostle of Jesus Christ, to those who reside as aliens scattered throughout Pontus, Galatia, Cappadocia, Asia, and Bithynia, who are chosen according to the foreknowledge of God, by the sanctifying work of the Spirit, to obey Jesus Christ and be sprinkled with His blood."

Preliminary Thoughts

This is a difficult subject for our minds and for our hearts. We must commit ourselves to biblical charity.

We must work to restrain our curiosity while rejecting avoidance.

Deuteronomy 29:29 The secret things belong to the Lord our God, but the things revealed belong to us and to our sons forever, that we may observe all the words of this law.

What is election?

It is revealed truth.

Mark 13:20

Unless the Lord had shortened those days, no life would have been saved; but for the sake of **the elect** whom He **chose** (*elected*), He shortened the days.

John 13:18

I do not speak of all of you. I know the ones I have chosen (elected)...

John 15:16

You did not **choose** (*elect*) Me, but I **chose** (*elected*) you, and appointed you, that you should go and bear fruit, and that your fruit should remain, that whatever you ask of the Father in My name, He may give to you.

John 15:19

If you were of the world, the world would love its own; but because you are not of the world, but I chose (*elected*) you out of the world, therefore the world hates you.

1 Corinthians 1:27-28

But God has **chosen** (*elected*) the foolish things of the world to shame the wise, and God has **chosen** (*elected*) the weak things of the world to shame the things which are strong, and the base things of the world and the despised, God has **chosen** (*elected*), the things that are not, that He might nullify the things that are, that no man should boast before God.

Ephesians 1:3-4

Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places in Christ, just as He **chose** (*elected*) us in Him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before Him.

For those whom He foreknew, He also predestined to become conformed to the image of His Son, so that He might be the first-born among many brethren; and these whom He predestined, He also called; and these whom He called, He also justified; and these whom He justified, He also glorified. What then shall we say to these things? If God is for us, who is against us? He who did not spare His own Son, but delivered Him over for us all, how will He not also with Him freely give us all things. Who will bring a charge against God's elect? God is the one who justifies.

Colossians 3:12

So, as those who have been **chosen** (*elect*) of God, holy and beloved, put on a heart of compassion, kindness, humility, gentleness and patience.

1 Thessalonians 1:2-4

We give thanks to God always for all of you, making mention of you in our prayers; constantly bearing in mind your work of faith and labor of love and steadfastness of hope in our Lord Jesus Christ in the presence of our God and Father, knowing, brethren beloved by God, His **choice** (*election*) of you;

2 Timothy 2:10

For this reason I endure all things for the sake of those who are **chosen** (*the elect*), so that they also may obtain the salvation which is in Christ Jesus and with it eternal glory.

Titus 1:1

Paul, a bond-servant of God, and an apostle of Jesus Christ, for the faith of those **chosen** (*the elect*) of God and the knowledge of the truth which is according to godliness...

Revelation 17:14

These will wage war against the Lamb, and the Lamb will overcome them, because He is Lord of lords and King of kings, and those who are with Him are the called and **chosen** (*elect*) and faithful.

"I need not multiply where I cannot exhaust."

What makes God's election difficult to accept?

An unwillingness to accept our true condition apart from grace.

Our Condition?

That we were dead in our sins, hostile to God, and deserving of God's wrath.

Ephesians 2:1 And you were dead in your trespasses and sins.

Colossians 2:13 And when you were dead in your transgressions and the uncircumcision of your flesh, <u>He made you alive</u> together with Him, having forgiven us all our transgressions...

Romans 8:6-8

For the mind set on the flesh is death...because the mind set on the flesh is hostile toward God; for it does not subject itself to the law of God, for it is **not even able to do so**; and those who are in the flesh cannot please God.

Ephesians 2:3

Among them we too all formerly lived in the lusts of our flesh, indulging the desires of the flesh and of the mind, and were **by nature children of wrath**, even as the rest.

Our Condition?

That we can contribute **nothing** for our salvation but are dependent entirely upon God's grace.

Romans 11:4-6
