

(Young's Literal Translation)



Then all men will fear, and will declare the work of God,
and will **consider what He has done.**

Psalm 107:43

Who is wise? Let him give heed to these things;
And **consider the lovingkindnesses of the LORD.**

Psalm 119:95

The wicked wait for me to destroy me;
I shall diligently **consider Your testimonies.**

Ecclesiastes 7:13

Consider the work of God,
For who is able to straighten what He has bent?

Isaiah 5:12-13

But they do not pay attention to the deeds of the LORD,
Nor do they consider the work of His hands.
Therefore My people go into exile for their lack of knowledge.

Consider the ravens...**consider** the lilies...

1 Corinthians 1:26

For **consider your calling**, brethren, that there were not many wise according to the flesh, not many mighty, not many noble...

You cannot defend something you have not labored to understand.





Your adversary, the devil, prowls about like a roaring lion,
seeking someone to devour.

A Suggested Response:

Take time at the start of each day to consider what pitfalls may lie in your path, then seek to apply the gospel in advance.

Maintaining sobriety.

What is intoxication?

Intoxication is loss of control over your mind and your emotions; and, consequently, over your behavior.

Intoxication

Genesis 9:21

[*Noah*] drank of the wine and became drunk,
and uncovered himself inside his tent.

1 Samuel 1:13

As for Hannah, she was speaking in her heart,
only her lips were moving, but her voice was not heard.
So Eli thought she was drunk.

Peter was clearly prohibiting physical drunkenness, but he had much more in mind.

Spiritual Intoxication

Isaiah 29:9

They become drunk, but not with wine;
They stagger, but not with strong drink.

Revelation 18:3

For all the nations have drunk of the wine of the passion of her immorality, and the kings of the earth have committed acts of immorality with her, and the merchants of the earth have become rich by the wealth of her sensuality.

Success, significance, identity.


Security, stability, control.


*Are you anticipating

Choose to hope in grace alone.


