

Philippians 2:5-7

Have this attitude in yourselves which was also in Christ Jesus, who, although He existed in the form of God, did not regard equality with God a thing to be grasped, but emptied Himself, taking the form of a bond-servant, being made in the likeness of men.

Who is Jesus?

He is the Revelation of God.

Because Jesus reveals God to us, faith and hope in Him is faith and hope in God!

He is your Mediator with God.

Why should knowing who Jesus is inspire life-transforming fear? What might it mean if you know who Jesus is, and yet your life is not marked by devotion to Him?

Hebrews 10:26-27

For if after receiving the knowledge of the truth we go on sinning willfully, there no longer remains a sacrifice for sins, but a certain terrifying expectation of judgment, and the fury of a fire which will consume the adversaries.

Fear of the Lord will destroy the presumption of willful disregard. Meditating upon the price, the plan, and the Person of your redemption will change your life.
