God's Wisdom for Our Lives – Week 4 Don't Follow Your Heart – Lead It! (Part 2)

Review

- 1. Over-Arching Theme of Proverbs: Wisdom
 - a. The foundation of Biblical wisdom: The fear of the LORD (Prov 1:7, 9:10, 31:30)
 - i. "Lord, I trust you, and what you say goes, no matter what".
- 2. The fear of the Lord leads to godliness in everyday life.
- 3. Key Theme: There are only two ways to live:

There is a way to life. That way is called wisdom, which is living in reference to God, in the fear of the Lord.

There is a way to death. That way is called folly, which is rejecting or living without reference to God.

Key Theme: Don't Follow Your Heart – Lead It!

- 4. We are commanded to lead our hearts (Prov 3:1).
 - a. We can, and are therefore responsible to direct our hearts
- 5. Trust in the Lord (lean on/depend on Him) with all your heart (mind, will, emotions, desires), and lean not on your own understanding (Prov 3:5).
 - a. Subject your entire inner person to the revealed will of God
 - b. Trusting that He is good and knows best, even when my instincts seem to indicate otherwise
- 6. Instead of being wise in your own eyes, fear the LORD (Prov 3:7)
