The reality of persecution:

Governmental or strong social persecution occurs in more than 60 countries.

600 million Christians were prevented from practicing their faith.

215 million experienced significant persecution.

Last year 90,000 Christians were killed around the world because of their faith.

23 Christian leaders were killed in Mexico, and dozens of evangelicals have been banished.

Why are we surprised by persecution?

We are tempted to be surprised.

Matthew 5:10

Blessed are those who have been persecuted on account of righteousness...

This Beatitude, like the others, is a corrective to the way we are inclined to think.

1 Peter 4:12

Beloved, do not be surprised at the fiery ordeal among you, which comes upon you for your testing, as though some strange thing were happening to you.

Why are we surprised by persecution?

Because we overestimate the goodness of people.

How do we see ourselves?

Luke 18:18-21

And a certain ruler questioned Him, saying, "Good Teacher, what shall I do to inherit eternal life?"

And Jesus said to him,
"Why do you call Me good? No one is good
except God alone."

We see Jesus as the ideal good guy and ourselves as basically good people who can learn to follow his example.

But what's God's assessment?

Psalm 14:2-3

God does not assess goodness on the basis of behavior but by the orientation of the heart.

John 8:34 Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, everyone who commits sin is the slave of sin."

Sin is not just a nuisance neighbor; it is a merciless master.

Proverbs 5:22

The iniquities of the wicked ensnare him, and he is held fast in the cords of his sin.

We are surprised by persecution because we underestimate the controlling power of sin.

Why are we surprised by persecution?

Because we underestimate the power of Satan.

Ephesians 6:11-12

Put on the full armor of God, that you may be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil. For our struggle is not against flesh and blood, but against the rulers, against the powers, against the world forces of this darkness, against the spiritual forces of wickedness in the heavenly places.

We are surprised by persecution because we forget who we're fighting.

Why shouldn't we be surprised by persecution?

1 Peter 4:12 Beloved, don't be surprised...

Why shouldn't we be surprised by persecution?

Because people love sin.

Psalm 50:16-21

But to the wicked God says, "What right have you to tell of My statutes, And to take My covenant in your mouth? For you hate discipline, And you cast My words behind you. When you see a thief, you are pleased with him, And you associate with adulterers.

Psalm 50:16-21

You let your mouth loose in evil, And your tongue frames deceit. You sit and speak against your brother; You slander your own mother's son. These things you have done, and I kept silent; You thought that I was just like you; I will reprove you, and state the case in order before your eyes.

God's righteousness, when displayed in the lives of His people, reproves the world of its sin.

Matthew 5:10

Blessed are those who have been persecuted **because of righteousness**, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.

It is the light of righteousness that provokes persecution.

Why?

John 3:19-20

And this is the judgment, that the light is come into the world, and men loved the darkness rather than the light; for their deeds were evil. For everyone who does evil hates the light, and does not come to the light, lest his deeds should be exposed.

The world is provoked to rage because righteousness reproves its lover.

Does your lifestyle reprove the darkness?

Why shouldn't we be surprised by persecution?

Because people love sin.

Because people hate Jesus.

Matthew 5:11

Blessed are you when people insult you, and persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you, on account of Me.

Ultimately, people will hate us because they hate Jesus.

John 15:18

If the world hates you, you know that it has hated Me before it hated you.

People hate Jesus because He exposes their sin.

John 7:7

The world...hates Me because I testify of it, that its deeds are evil.

If the goal is to get people to like Jesus, we will need to change who He is.

Does you life look enough like Jesus to earn the ire of a sinful world?

Why shouldn't we be surprised by persecution?

Because people love sin.

Because people serve Satan.

Acts 26:17-18

"...I am sending you to open their eyes so that they may turn from darkness to light and from the dominion of Satan to God..."

People hate Jesus because He seeks to dethrone their master.

Matthew 6:24

No one can serve two masters; for either he will hate the one and love the other, or he will hold to one and despise the other.

Human autonomy is an illusion; either Jesus or Satan is on the throne.

Who's on your throne?

John 15:19

If you were of the world, the world would love its own; but because you are not of the world, but I chose you out of the world, therefore the world hates you.

Persecution identifies you as belonging to Christ.

Why should you rejoice when persecuted?

Because persecution confirms your identity.

Because persecution connects you to Christ.

Matthew 5:11

Blessed are you when people insult you, and persecute you, and falsely say all kinds of evil against you, on account of Me.

John 15:20

Remember the word that I said to you,
A slave is not greater than his master.
If they persecuted Me,
they will also persecute you...

True persecution connects you to your master.

1 Peter 4:13

...but to the degree that you share the sufferings of Christ, keep on rejoicing; so that also at the revelation of His glory, you may rejoice with exultation.

We rejoice in persecution because it allows us to share in both the suffering and hope of our Savior.

Why should you rejoice when persecuted?

Because persecution confirms your identity. Because persecution connects you to Christ.

Because persecution corrals your heart.
