New City Catechism Class Week Twenty-Three

Q23: Why must the Redeemer be truly God?

A23: That because of His divine nature His obedience and suffering would be perfect and effective; and also that He would be able to bear the righteous anger of God against sin and yet overcome death.

Acts 2:24 "God raised Him up, loosing the pangs of death, because it was not possible for him to be held by it." (ESV)

Discuss the question:

- With what do we struggle more—Jesus' humanity or Jesus' deity?
- Why do you think this is?
- Why does the question use the word "truly"?
- What are some common views held by those who reject the deity of Christ?

Discuss the Scripture:

- What imagery is evoked by the phrase "loosing the pangs of death"?
- Why was it not possible for Christ to be held by death? (Discuss Chrysostom's comments.)
- What does the resurrection of Christ prove (cf. 1 Corinthians 15:16)?
- What is the connection between Christ's resurrection and our forgiveness? Cf. Matthew 9:2-6. What does this say about the person of Christ?

Discuss the answer in light of the Scripture:

- Why was it necessary for Christ to have a divine nature in order to make His obedience perfect? His suffering?
- Why was this necessary to make His obedience effective? His suffering?
- Why was it necessary for Christ to have a divine nature in order to bear the righteous anger of God against sin?
- How does the resurrection prove that He did this?
- Why do these truths make it absolutely necessary to hold to the exclusivity of Christ for redemption?

If Jesus is God, how ought we to respond to His teaching? Does the reality that Jesus is God affect your responsiveness to Him?
