New City Catechism Class Week Thirty-eight

Q38: What is prayer?

A38: Prayer is pouring out our hearts to God in praise, petition, confession of sin, and thanksgiving.

Psalm 62:8 Trust in him at all times, O people; pour out your heart before him; God is a refuge for us. (ESV)

Discuss the question:

- Why should we pray?
- What prevents us from praying?

Discuss the Scripture:

- What are psalms?
- What is the context of Ps 62?
- How does prayer help us to trust in the LORD at all times?
- Who does the psalmist call to prayer?
- What does it look like to pour out our hearts before God? (1 Sam 1:15; Ps 42:4; Lam 2:19)
- What is a refuge? How is God a refuge for us?
- What do verses 11-12 communicate to us about the character of God and how he relates to his people?

Discuss the answer in light of the Scripture:

- How might praise in prayer take shape? (Luke 1:46-55)
- How might petition in prayer take shape? (1 Sam 1:9-17)
- How might confession of sin in prayer take shape? (Ps 51)
- How might thanksgiving in prayer take shape? (Phil 4:4-6)
- With prayer as your frame of reference, how would you answer this question from last week: How can we, in an ongoing way, remain dependent upon and receive the help we need from the Holy Spirit?
