The Father's Promise

Acts 2:33

Therefore having been exalted to the right hand of God, and having received from the Father the promise of the Holy Spirit,
He has poured forth this which you both see and hear.

But what is the promise?

Ezekiel 36:25-27

Then I will sprinkle clean water on you, and you will be clean;
I will cleanse you from all your filthiness and from all your idols.

Moreover, I will give you a new heart

and put a new spirit within you;

and I will remove the heart of stone from your flesh

and give you a heart of flesh.

And I will put My Spirit within you

and cause you to walk in My statutes,

and you will be careful to observe My ordinances.

The promise of the Spirit is the promise of a **new** covenant, a new relationship to God.

Jeremiah 31:31-33

"Behold, days are coming," declares the LORD, "when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and with the house of Judah... ...But this is the covenant which I will make with the house of Israel after those days," declares the LORD, "I will put My law within them, and on their heart I will write it; and I will be their God, and they shall be My people."

What is the gift of the Spirit?

It is the promise of the new covenant.

It is the baptism Jesus promised.

The Spirit now indwells all those who belong to Christ, and they are now **ALL** priests and prophets.

Numbers 11:29

But Moses said to him, "Are you jealous for my sake? Would that all the Lord's people were prophets, that the Lord would put His Spirit upon them!"

This is what God has done!

How does the Holy Spirit apply the benefits of the gospel to you?

The Spirit empowers you.

Acts 1:8

"...but you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you; and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth."

The power we receive begins with the new life created in us by the Spirit.

Romans 6:4

Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, in order that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life.

The Spirit's work of regeneration leads to our renewed ability to fulfill the purposes of declaring and displaying the gospel.

Acts 1:8

"...but you shall receive power when the Holy Spirit has come upon you;

and you shall be My witnesses both in Jerusalem,

and in all Judea and Samaria, and even to the remotest part of the earth."

The Spirit empowers you.

The Spirit sanctifies you, giving you power over sin.

Romans 8:13-14

...but if **by the Spirit** you are putting to death the deeds of the body, you will live. For all who are being led by the Spirit of God, these are sons of God.

The Spirit sanctifies you.

The Spirit teaches you.

John 14:26

But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name,

He will teach you all things,

and bring to your remembrance all that I said to you.

The Spirit empowers you.

The Spirit sanctifies you.

The Spirit teaches you.

The Spirit seals you, securing your salvation.

Ephesians 1:13-14

In Him, you also, after listening to the message of truth, the gospel of your salvation-- having also believed,

you were sealed in Him with the Holy Spirit of promise,

who is given as a pledge of our inheritance, with a view to the redemption of God's own possession, to the praise of His glory.

Ephesians 4:30

And do not grieve the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption.

If you belong to Christ, the Holy Spirit guarantees your salvation and is applying to you all of the good gifts of the gospel.
