Main Idea

The second Word reminds us of the pure and uncontainable nature of God and requires that we worship Him in spirit and in truth.

When we say that God is immaterial, we mean that He does not consist of physical or bodily matter and cannot be seen.

1 Timothy 1:17

Now to the King eternal, immortal, **invisible**, the only God, be honor and glory forever and ever. Amen.


1 Timothy 6:15-16

John 4:24

"God is spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth."

This does not mean that God is less "real" in spite of what our materialistic world believes!

What does the 2nd Word teach?

That God is immaterial (spirit)

That God is indescribable

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But why?

Psalm 145:3 Great is the LORD, and highly to be praised; And His greatness is unsearchable.

Romans 11:33

Oh, the depth of the riches both of the wisdom and knowledge of God! **How unsearchable** are His judgments and **unfathomable** His ways!

Much of Israel's idolatry was not intentional worship of other gods but attempts to represent the LORD.

But images and idols serve as descriptions that inevitably distort the true identity of our indescribable God.

Isaiah 40:25

To whom then will you liken Me That I should be his equal?" says the Holy One.

What does the 2nd Word teach?

That God is immaterial (spirit)

That God is indescribable

That God is limitless


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But why?

1 Kings 8:27

"But will God indeed dwell on the earth?
Behold, heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain
You, how much less this house which I have built!"



Jeremiah 23:24

Can a man hide himself in hiding places, so I do not see him?" declares the LORD.

"Do I not fill the heavens and the earth?" declares the LORD.

Images and idols serve to contain and limit God in some way!

What about God's jealousy?

Deuteronomy 5:9-10

You shall not bow down to them or serve them; for I the LORD your God am a jealous God, visiting the iniquity of the fathers on the children to the third and fourth generation of those who hate me, but showing steadfast love to thousands of those who love me and keep my commandments.

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For the Lord your God is a consuming fire, a jealous God.

Exodus 34:14

For you shall not worship any other god, for the LORD, whose name is Jealous, is a jealous God.

First, we must take to heart that even if the desire is only to represent God and not replace Him, yet because an image cannot but portray something other than God as He truly is, It is the worship of another!

Second, we are only too happy, and even right at times, to zealously defend our own honor or possessions, but will we deny God His true right to do the same?

Third, were God unprovoked by the worship of other gods, He Himself would violate the 1st commandment, ceasing to be God as He is.

What about the "generational curse"?

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Reckless teachers have done great harm with this passage, burdening families with the false baggage of hand-me-down guilt.

But what do the Scriptures say?

Listen to the Lord's rebuke:

Ezekiel 18:1-4

Then the word of the LORD came to me saying, "What do you mean by using this proverb concerning the land of Israel saying, 'The fathers eat the sour grapes, But the children's teeth are set on edge'? "As I live," declares the Lord God, "you are surely not going to use this proverb in Israel anymore. Behold, all souls are Mine; the soul of the father as well as the soul of the son is Mine. The soul who sins will die."

And He goes on...

Ezekiel 18:20

The son will not bear the punishment for the father's iniquity, nor will the father bear the punishment for the son's iniquity; the righteousness of the righteous will be upon himself, and the wickedness of the wicked will be upon himself.

But look again at our passage...

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And what about the cross?

Galatians 3:13

Christ redeemed us from the curse of the Law, having become a curse for us-- for it is written, "Cursed is everyone who hangs on a tree."

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

How do you break the 2nd Word?

When you objectify God, you break this Word.

To objectify someone is to depersonalize him or her for your own gratification.

In fact, self-gratification is at the heart of idolatry.

Jeremiah 44:15-16

Then all the men who were aware that their wives were burning sacrifices to other gods, along with all the women who were standing by, as a large assembly, including all the people who were living in Pathros in the land of Egypt, responded to Jeremiah, saying, "As for the message that you have spoken to us in the name of the LORD, we are not going to listen to you!"

"But rather we will certainly carry out every word that has proceeded from our mouths, by burning sacrifices to the queen of heaven and pouring out libations to her, just as we ourselves, our forefathers, our kings and our princes did in the cities of Judah and in the streets of Jerusalem; for then we had plenty of food, and were well off, and saw no misfortune."

When you make God your means to a better life, you objectify Him, reducing Him to a household idol.

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You shall not even make God Himself into an object for your personal use.

How do you break the 2nd Word?

When you objectify God, you break this Word.

When you form your conception of God to fit *your* thinking, purposes, or desires, you break this Word.

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or that is in the water under the earth.

Idolatry is forming God into an image or likeness, even if only in the mind, that fits our conceptions of Him and of the world.

Isaiah 40:18

To whom then will you liken God?
Or what likeness will you compare with Him?

Yet we will say, "I would never serve a god who..."

How do you break the 2nd Word?

When you objectify God, you break this Word.

When you form your conception of God to fit your thinking, purposes, or desires, you break this Word.

When you forget God or act as if He is not present with you, you break this Word.

Psalm 139:7

Where can I go from Your Spirit?
Or where can I flee from Your presence?

Yet idols are placed in a room and forgotten when left behind.

Forgetting God during your day or acting as if He doesn't see what your are doing or know what you are thinking is akin to you leaving Him behind in your living room.

How do you break the 2nd Word?

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When you forget God or act as if He is not present with you, you break this Word.

When you think God is more present in one place than another, you break this Word.

1 Kings 8:27

"But will God indeed dwell on the earth?
Behold, heaven and the highest heaven cannot contain
You, how much less this house which I have built!"

When you think God hears you better or is more present in some place, you deny His immaterial, limitless presence.

How do you break the 2nd Word?

When you objectify God, you break this Word.

When you form your conception of God to fit your thinking, purposes, or desires, you break this Word.

When you forget God or act as if He is not present with you, you break this Word.

When you think God is more present in one place than another, you break this command.

When you incorporate the practices or beliefs of other religions into your faith, you break this Word.

Exodus 32:3-4

Then all the people tore off the gold rings which were in their ears, and brought them to Aaron. And he took this from their hand, and fashioned it with a graving tool, and made it into a molten calf; and they said, "This is your god, O Israel, who brought you up from the land of Egypt."

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
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who brought you up from the land of Egypt.

The people were *not* seeking to worship some other god.

They were seeking to enhance their own worship experience by incorporating pagan practices.

How the 2nd Word instruct you?

It instructs you to worship in spirit.

Psalm 25:1
To You, O Lord, I lift up my soul.

Psalm 103:1

Bless the LORD, **O my soul**; And all that is within me, bless His holy name.

Jesus' Instruction

John 4:23-24

"But an hour is coming, and now is, when the true worshipers shall worship the Father in spirit and truth; for such people the Father seeks to be His worshipers.

God is spirit, and those who worship Him must worship in spirit and truth.

What does it mean to worship in spirit? It is worship made possible only by the enlivening of the Holy Spirit.

Isaiah 29:13

Jesus answered, "Truly, truly, I say to you, unless one is **born of** water and **the Spirit**, he cannot enter into the kingdom of God. That which is born of the flesh is flesh, and that which is born of the Spirit is spirit."

Philippians 3:3

"...for we are the true circumcision, who worship in the Spirit of God and glory in Christ Jesus and put no confidence in the flesh.

What does it mean to worship in spirit?

It is worship made possible only by the enlivening of the Holy Spirit.

It is worship generated, governed and directed by your heart or inner person.

Psalm 103:1

Bless the LORD, O my soul;

And all that is within me, bless His holy name.

Matthew 22:37

You shall love the LORD your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.

What does it mean to worship in spirit?

It is worship made possible by the enlivening of the Holy Spirit.

It is worship generated, governed and directed by your heart or inner person.

It is the happy response of your soul to God Himself.

Psalm 95:1-2

O Come, let us sing for joy to the LORD; Let us shout joyfully to the rock of our salvation. Let us come before His presence with thanksgiving; Let us shout joyfully to Him with psalms.

How the 2nd Word instruct you?

It instructs you to worship in spirit.

It instructs you to worship in truth.

John 4:23-24


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God is spirit, and those who worship Him

must worship in spirit and truth.

Psalm 145:18

The LORD is near to all who call upon Him, To all who call upon Him in truth.

Calling upon the Lord in truth is surely calling upon Him according to what is true.

What does it mean to worship in truth? It is worship informed and governed by truth.

It is worship that flows out of what is *truly* in the heart.

Mark 7:6-7

And He said to them, "Rightly did Isaiah prophesy of you hypocrites, as it is written, 'This people honors Me with their lips, But their heart is far away from Me.

Faith is not lived out by words or only in our head space; it is actually *lived out* in truth!

Concluding Thoughts:

We must fight the temptation to form images or conceptions of God, even if only in our minds, in an effort to bring Him down to us.

We must labor to avoid intellectualism or emotionalism, keeping our worship tethered to truth while engaging our whole person.

We must remember that true worship is not manufactured; it is from and by the Spirit.
