Main Idea The great command of all Scripture is to love the LORD alone; and this will entail listening to Him alone, fearing Him alone, and teaching His Word alone.



What is true love?

Love for God is the *filter* for all other love.



Love the LORD Alone Love the LORD alone by *listening* to Him alone.

Listening to the Lord *alone* is a recognition that there is nothing whatsoever in this world that is not *theological*.

Listen to the Lord alone! Open your ears wide to hear His voice.

Do not prioritize experience!

God's *written* Word to you is God's voice for you now. Be careful to hear all things through it!

Love the Lord Alone

Love the Lord alone by listening to Him alone.

Love the LORD alone by fearing Him alone.

Fear Him!

"...fear the Lord your God" (v 2) "...be careful" (v 3)

"...take care" (v 12)

"It is the LORD your God you shall fear." (v 13)

"The Lord commanded us... to fear the Lord our God." (v 24)

But what does it mean to "fear the Lord"? Fearing the LORD is not something different than loving Him. Fearing Him is the way that you love Him. Fearing Him begins by seeing Him in His holiness, expands by knowing Him more and more, and is demonstrated by *loving* obedience.

Fear the Lord alone!

Open your eyes wide to see His holiness.

See and know Him in His holiness!

See and know His holiness in His commandments to you! See and know that "The Lord our God, the Lord is one" (v 4) See the good land and know that it was He who "brought us out of Egypt with a mighty hand" (v 21) See and know that God is Holy and mighty and do not presume upon His grace!

Fear the Lord alone!

Open your eyes wide to see His holiness.

Close your eyes tight to competing masters.

Why "masters"? Because you fear the master that you serve!
