Why?

before the LORD empty-handed. Every man shall give
as he is able, according to the blessing of **the LORD**
your God that he has given you.

The phrase is used **282x** in Deuteronomy!



1 Corinthians 5:7-8

Therefore, being always of good courage, and knowing that while we are at home in the body we are absent from the Lord-- for we walk by faith, not by sight-- we are of good courage, I say, and prefer rather to be absent from the body and to be at home with the Lord.

Our bodies are our temporary
tabernacles, but we can rejoice in
them awaiting our permanent
dwelling in the presence of Christ!
