Warm-Up:

- 2. What are some common areas where we struggle to do so?
- 3. What are some of the consequences of failing to "live in the future"?
- 4. What's the difference between a godly concern for the future and sinful worry?
- 5. How can worry actually be the result of not seeing the future in reference to God?

Prov 21:5 "The plans of the diligent lead surely to advantage, but everyone who is hasty comes surely to poverty"

- 6. What is the diligent one doing in Proverbs 21:5?
 - a. What does it lead to?
 - i. Give some examples of how diligent planning leads to blessing:
- 7. What does it mean to be hasty?
 - a. What does being hasty lead to?
 - i. Give some examples of how being hasty leads to being in need or somehow in want:

Proverbs 27:1 "Do not boast about tomorrow, for you do not know what a day may bring forth"

- 8. Consider Proverbs 27:1... What's condemned in this verse?
- 9. What's the difference between planning for tomorrow and "boasting about tomorrow"
- 10. How is planning for tomorrow and considering the future actually commanded in this verse?
 - a. How is planning for the future actually a product of humility?

Prov 22:3 "The prudent sees the evil and hides himself, but the naïve go on and are punished for it"

- 11. What does it mean that the prudent "sees" evil?
- 12. What does the wise/prudent one do when he sees evil or trouble?
- 13. In contrast what does the simple/naïve one do?
 - a. According to this verse, what does "going on" when we see trouble or evil lead to?
 - i. Give some examples of the consequences that follow when we go on like that:
- 14. How can having a biblically informed imagination help you to stay on the path of life?

Read 1 John 3:2-3

- 15. How does John describe our present state in verse 2?
- 16. How does John describe our future state in verse 2?
- 17. What are the implications for the believer in verse 3?
- 18. How should "living in the future" impact and motivate our sanctification as Christians?

Reflection:

With humility in hand, the Proverbs teach us to imagine the future. The following questions help us do this...

- 19. Are you exercising the humility of planning for the future? Or do you tend to live only day-to-day?
- 20. Are you laboring to build up the church and in future generations of disciples and disciple-makers? Do you believe that God intends for His church to grow and impact the world in the future?
- 21. What are you doing that you want to remain private? Forecast into the future and imagine your life when the private becomes public, because it will someday become public.
- 22. What have you learned from the funerals of the wise and funerals of the foolish? Similarly, what have you learned from those who are older than yourself?
- 23. Have you recently ignored the advice of two godly people who have given you the same advice?
- 24. How is your future tied to Jesus Christ? Do you expect that He will continue the sanctifying work in you that He started?
