 - 11. Consider Proverbs 16:26... how does a worker's appetite work for him?
 - a. What do these verses teach us about one of God's design for work? (2 Thess 3:10)
 - b. How do these verses instruct parents in teaching their children to work?

Read Proverbs 10:4-5... "A slack hand causes poverty, but the hand of the diligent makes rich. He who gathers in summer is a prudent son, but he who sleeps in harvest is a son who brings shame."

- 12. What does proverbs 10 teach us about the manner in which a wise person works?
- 13. What is a "slack hand", and what does it lead to?
 - a. What kinds of work does this apply to?
- 14. What does it mean to be diligent?
 - a. What does diligence have to do with working in reference to God?
- 15. Consider Proverbs 10:5... what is being commended here, and what is being condemned?

Read Proverbs 22:29... "Do you see a man skilled in his work? He will stand before kings; he will not stand before obscure men."

- 16. What is the man recognized for in this verse?
 - a. What does it mean to be skilled in your work?
 - b. Does God care whether or not you are skilled in your work? Why or why not?
 - c. Does God want us to recognize the skills of others in their work? Why or why not?

Read Colossians 3:22-24

- 17. Consider verse 22... Who is being addressed, and in what context?
 - a. How does this apply to us?
- 18. According to Paul in verse 22, what is our motivation for obedience and service?
 - a. What does Paul tie together with "sincerity of heart"?
- 19. When we obey and serve and work, who is it that we ultimately serve?
 - a. What difference should this make?
- 20. What does it mean to "do your work heartily as for the Lord, rather than for men"?
- 21. Is the Lord your boss?
 - a. What's the difference between the Lord and your boss?
