Main Idea

In his Gospel, John holds out the eternal Word to the world and then shows us both how the world should and how it does respond to Him.

Responding to the Eternal Word What is John's Gospel about?



What is this Gospel about: a Prologue It is about the eternal Word come into the world.

The Word is what concerns John 1 John 1:1 What was from the beginning, what we have heard, what we have seen with our eyes, what we have looked at and touched with our hands, <u>concerning the Word</u> of Life.

But why use the word "Word"? Genesis 1:3 Then **God said**, "Let there be light"; and there was light." Jesus is the creative Word of God made visible!

But why use the word "Word"?

Deuteronomy 4:12 Then the LORD spoke to you from the midst of the fire; you heard the sound of words, but you saw no form — only a voice.

Jesus is the mind of God made visible!

But why use the word "Word"?

Deuteronomy 4:13 So He declared to you His covenant which He commanded you to perform, that is, the Ten Commandments [*the Ten Words*]; and He wrote them on two tablets of stone.

Jesus is the commandment of God made visible!

John's Gospel is about Jesus, the eternal Word come into the world. We must be careful not to make the gospel about ourselves or about the benefits of Christ found in it!

What is this Gospel about?

It is about the eternal Word come into the world.

It is about the world's responses to this Word.

John's Gospel is about the world, but it is about the world's *response to the Word*.

John shows us responses:

John 1:5 and 9-11 The Light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not comprehend it. There was the true Light which, coming into the world, enlightens every man. He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him. He came to His own, and those who were His own did not receive Him.

John shows us responses:

John 7:30-31

So they were seeking to seize Him; and no man laid his hand on Him, because His hour had not yet come. But many of the crowd believed in Him.

John 11:45-46

Therefore many of the Jews who came to Mary, and saw what He had done, believed in Him. But some of them went to the Pharisees and told them the things which Jesus had done. John's Gospel will yield for us a better understanding of the world and its responses to the Word.

Jesus <u>is</u> life and the source of life! John 5:26 For just as the Father has life in Himself, even so He gave to the Son also **to have life in Himself**.

Jesus <u>is</u> life and the source of life! John 6:47 I am the bread of life. John 11:25 I am the resurrection and the life. John 14:6 I am the way, and the truth, and the life.

There can be no life apart from the One who <u>is</u> life!

A general statement about the world

How does the world respond? His own *reject* Him

The darkened mind rejects or ignores the Word and refuses to listen to Him or even to understand Him.

How does the world respond?

It is the new birth that makes one a child of God and that *precedes* the reception of the Word by faith.

Those who are His own, God causes to be born again, and they receive Him and believe in His name.
