Main Idea

Christian community is essential, especially in times of trouble, but that community will only endure difficulty if it is constituted correctly.

John is addressing Christian connection:

What is this intimacy? **Emotional Connection Intellectual Connection Preferential Connection** But note that neither proximity nor exclusivity are foundational to Christian connection.

But note that fellowship is something <u>we have</u> not something we do.

1 John 1:3

What we have seen and heard we proclaim to you also, so that you too **may** <u>have</u> fellowship with us; and indeed our fellowship is with the Father.

1 John 1:7

But if we walk in the Light as He Himself is in the Light, we <u>have</u> fellowship with one another. Christian fellowship does work, but the work of fellowship is not what forms it. It's what follows from it.

Constituting Christian Community

Choose to reject misguided foundations

Choose to embrace *Christian* connections

Embrace Christian Connections Embrace the connections of your new position. Fellowship is a "positional" reality.

Your Old Position

You were in darkness (2:8, 11) You were in the world (2:16) You were abiding in death (3:14) You were living in fear (4:18) You were in the power of the evil one (5:19)

Your New Position

You were in darkness (2:8, 11) You were in the world (2:16) You were abiding in death (3:14) You were living in fear (4:18) You were in the power of the evil one (5:19) You are in the light (1:7; 2:10) You are in the Son (2:24; 5:10) You are in the Father (2:24) You are in the Father's love (2:15) You are in God (4:15)

The fellowship that we *have* with the Father and the Son and with one another is due to our *position* in Christ! It is our position in Christ that unites us; we are all together in Him! This means that Christian community will break the barriers of cultural position and unite people who do not "belong" together.

Embrace Christian Connections

Embrace the connections of your new position.

A New Identity

You <u>were</u> a child of the devil!

1 John 3:10 By this the children of God and the children of the devil are obvious. You *are* a child of God!

1 John 3:2 Beloved, <u>now</u> we are children of God...

You now have an unbreakable family connection with the Father and the Son and with every member of this eternal family!

A New Identity

You <u>were</u> dead!

1 John 3:14 He who does not love abides in death. You *are* alive!

1 John 3:14 We know that we have passed out of death into life.

You now have a shared life with every believer because this new life is vitally connected to the Source of Life! Ultimately, it is identity that constitutes community. Identity validates belonging.

With this new identity and position also come new possessions--possessions that we all share.

Look at what John says we "have" together: We all have the same advocate (2:1) We all have the same anointing (2:20) We all have the same Father (2:23) We all have the same hope (3:3) We all have the same eternal life (5:13) We all proclaim the same message!

Embrace Christian Connections

Embrace the connections of your new position. Embrace the connections of your new identity. Embrace the connections of your new doctrine.

1 John 1:3-4 What we have seen and heard we proclaim to you also, so that you too may have fellowship with us... these things we write, so that our joy may be made complete. We believe a specific message that constitutes the Christian community!

Change the message, and you change the community!

Note again the cause of John's joy:

Worldly occupation is an orientation of the heart that will become frustrated with and will turn away from true Christian community.

John's occupation of proclamation was clearly important, but only because it was a part of a greater mission.
