The Gospel According to John "Identity, Authority, and Faith"

John 5:30-47



"I can do nothing on My own initiative.

As I hear, I judge; and My judgment is just, because I do not seek My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me. If I alone testify about Myself, My testimony is not true. There is another who testifies of Me, and I know that the testimony which He gives about Me is true."

"You have sent to John, and he has testified to the truth. But the testimony which I receive is not from man, but I say these things so that you may be saved. He was the lamp that was burning and was shining and you were willing to rejoice for a while in his light. But the testimony which I have is greater than the testimony of John; for the works which the Father has given Me to accomplish — the very works that I do testify about Me, that the Father has sent Me."

John 5:37-40

"And the Father who sent Me, He has testified of Me. You have neither heard His voice at any time nor seen His form. You do not have His word abiding in you, for you do not believe Him whom He sent. You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life; it is these that testify about Me; and you are unwilling to come to Me so that you may have life."

John 5:41-44

"I do not receive glory from men; but I know you, that you do not have the love of God in yourselves. I have come in My Father's name, and you do not receive Me; if another comes in his own name, you will receive him. "Do not think that I will accuse you before the Father; the one who accuses you is Moses, in whom you have set your hope. For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me, for he wrote about Me.

But if you do not believe his writings, how will you believe My words?"

Main Idea

Jesus' identity and authority are clearly confirmed, but prideful independence, desire for acceptance, and doubt prevent people from coming to Him by faith and receiving His word for life.

Identity, Authority, and Faith

How is Jesus' identity and authority confirmed?



Who is He, and what authority does He have?

John 5:30-32

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Jesus is one with the Father

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Jesus, being God in the flesh, cannot act or speak independently of God.

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If Jesus and the Father are one, then He is *the* Authority for all of life, and it would be foolish to think or act independently of Him!

How is His Identity and Authority Confirmed? By the testimony of John the Baptist

"You have sent to John, and he has testified to the truth.

But the testimony which I receive is not from man,
but I say these things so that you may be saved.

He was the lamp that was burning and was shining
and you were willing to rejoice for a while in his light."

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By the testimony of John the Baptist

By the testimony of Jesus' works

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John 5:36

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Consider the works that Jesus did:

He turned water into wine.

He healed a boy from a distance.

He made a lame man walk.

He fed thousands with a few loaves and fishes.

He gave sight to a man born blind.

He raised the dead.

He conquered death once for all!

Listen to the wisdom of a blind man:

John 9:30-33

The man answered and said to them, "Well, here is an amazing thing, that you do not know where He is from, and yet He opened my eyes. We know that God does not hear sinners; but if anyone is God-fearing and does His will, He hears him. Since the beginning of time it has never been heard that anyone opened the eyes of a person born blind. If this man were not from God, He could do nothing."

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By the testimony of the Father

John 5:32

"There is another who testifies of Me, and I know that the testimony which He gives about Me is true."

John 5:37

"And the Father who sent Me,
He has testified of Me."

The Father's Testimony

Matthew 3:17

"...and behold, a voice out of the heavens said, "This is My beloved Son, in whom I am well-pleased."

Matthew 17:5

While he was still speaking,
a bright cloud overshadowed them,
and behold, a voice out of the cloud said,
"This is My beloved Son, with whom I am well-pleased;
listen to Him!"

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By the testimony of the Father

By the testimony of the Scriptures

"You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life;

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it is these that testify about Me.

Examples:

Deuteronomy 18:15

"The LORD your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your countrymen, you shall listen to him."

Psalm 2:6-7

But as for Me, I have installed My King
Upon Zion, My holy mountain.
I will surely tell of the decree of the LORD:
He said to Me, "You are My Son,
Today I have begotten You."

Examples:

Isaiah 53:5

But He was pierced through for our transgressions,
He was crushed for our iniquities;
The chastening for our well-being fell upon Him,
And by His scourging we are healed.

Luke 24:27

Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures.

John 5:39-40

"You search the Scriptures because you think that in them you have eternal life;

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and you are unwilling to come to Me so that you may have life."

They had all the evidence they needed, yet they refused to come to Him for life.

What prevents people from coming? Prideful Independence

"I can do nothing on My own initiative. **As I hear, I judge**; and My judgment is just, because I do not seek My own will, but the will of Him who sent Me."

This is set in contrast to the Jews who refused to come under the authority of another or do the will of another.

They were their own judges, assessing the truth and setting the rules on their own authority, all the while claiming to be "under the Law".

Who were they willing to receive?

John 5:43

"I have come in My Father's name, and you do not receive Me; if another comes in his own name, you will receive him."

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"I have come in My Father's name, and you do not receive Me;

if another comes in his own name, you will receive him.

Why?

They received one another on the basis of mutual affirmation.

But Jesus came with His own authority, an authority that demands humble submission!

In our age of rampant individualism, we should be especially wary of ourselves. Are we willing to lay down our prideful independence and truly come under the authorities Christ has established? What keeps you from submission?

What prevents people from coming?

Prideful Independence

Fear of Man

"I do not receive glory from men; but I know you, that you do not have the love of God in yourselves. I have come in My Father's name, and you do not receive Me; if another comes in his own name, you will receive him."

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Jesus did not come to impress men and win their approval.

"I do not receive glory from men; but I know you, that you do not have the love of God in yourselves.

I have come in My Father's name, and you do not receive Me; if another comes in his own name, you will receive him."

The affections of their hearts were not set on God so as to please Him, but on themselves so as to please men.

John 12:43

"For they loved the approval of men rather than the approval of God."

It is impossible to fear God and to fear man!

Galatians 1:10

For am I now seeking the favor of men, or of God?

Or am I striving to please men?

If I were still trying to please men,

I would not be a slave of Christ.

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In fact, fear of man *prevents* faith in Christ!

"How can you believe, when you receive glory from one another and you do not seek the glory that is from the one and only God?"

When you seek the approval of others.

John 5:44

"How can you believe, when you receive glory from one another and you do not seek the glory

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Rather than the approval of God.

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from one another and you do not seek the glory that is from the one and only God?"

The way of Christ is often offensive, alienating, and without appreciation; so if you have as your goal to be liked, accepted, or praised by others you will not faithfully follow Christ.

Luke 6:26

"Woe to you when all men speak well of you, for their fathers used to treat the false prophets in the same way."

What prevents people from coming?

Prideful Independence

Fear of Man

The forgetfulness of unbelief

The issue is unbelief! John 5:44 "How can you believe..."

John 5:46-47

"For if you believed Moses, you would believe Me, for he wrote about Me. But if you do not believe his writings, how will you believe My words?"

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John 5:38

"You do not have His word abiding in you, for you do not believe Him whom He sent."

John 5:38

You do not have His word abiding in you.

How easy it is to hear and be moved but then to go away and forget!

How do we receive His Word for life? By hearing it with eyes of faith

John 5:37

"You have neither heard His voice at any time nor seen His form."

"You have neither <u>heard</u> His voice at any time nor <u>seen</u> His form."

John 5:37

"You have neither <u>heard</u> His voice at any time nor <u>seen</u> His form."

Yet here they were *hearing* the Word and *seeing* the Word and refusing to believe what they heard or saw!

Do not believe that faith will come by hearing His voice or by seeing some manifestation of power. Your faith will be your ears and eyes enabling you to hear and see!

How do we receive His Word for life?

By hearing it with eyes of faith

By taking it into ourselves as our authority for all of life

An intended contrast:

John 5:33-35

"You have sent to John, and he has testified to the truth.

But the testimony which I receive is not from man,
but I say these things so that you may be saved.

He was the lamp that was burning and was
shining and you were willing to rejoice
for a while in his light."

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John had stirred interest and even delight for a while because some of what he had to say tickled their Jewish ears.

But it didn't "stick"!

John 5:38

"You do not have His word abiding in you, for you do not believe Him whom He sent."

They didn't really believe and so did not receive God's word into their hearts as their governing authority.

They abided in their own authority!

To have the word abiding in you is to experience a regime change of your heart whereby **the** Word overthrows your self and is established as your governing authority for all of life.

Is Jesus your authority for all of your life?

How do we receive His Word for life?

By hearing it with eyes of faith

By taking it into ourselves as our authority for all of life

By keeping His words out of love

John 5:42

"...but I know you, that you do not have the love of God in yourselves."

How did Jesus know that they did not have the love of God in themselves?

John 5:42

"...but I know you, that you do not have the love of God in yourselves."

How did Jesus know that they did not have the love of God in themselves?

John 5:43

"I have come in My Father's name, and you do not receive Me."

To love the Father is to love His Son and receive Him as He is: as the Christ and King who came to save and rule. This they were unwilling to do!

How do you know you have the love of God in you?

John 14:23-24

Jesus answered and said to him, "If anyone loves Me, he will keep My word; and My Father will love him, and We will come to him and make Our abode with him."

"He who does not love Me does not keep My words; and the word which you hear is not Mine, but the Father's who sent Me."

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You cannot obey to obtain life; but if you have obtained life, you will desire to obey because the love of God will be in you.
