All people are in need of being set free from that which truly enslaves us.

This true freedom is not something we can obtain by our own means - it is only (and surely) granted by Christ to those who belong to Him.

As He spoke these things, many came to believe in Him. So Jesus was saying **to those** Jews **who had believed** Him, ...

The surprising offense of Jesus' teaching a) "Belief" is not enough (vs 31)

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John 8:31-32

³¹ So Jesus was saying to those Jews who had believed Him, **"If you continue in My word**, then you are truly disciples of Mine; ³² and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." Continuing in Jesus' word means believing on Him and receiving Him as he offers Himself – as the only way for us to be saved. This is ongoing and is evidenced by our continued belief in the gospel message and continual trust in Christ.

Continue in Jesus' word = Keep believing the Gospel and trusting in Christ alone.

If you do that, then it proves that you are truly disciples of Christ, and you will be free indeed!

³² and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free."

³³ They answered Him, "We are Abraham's descendants and have never yet been enslaved to anyone; **how is it that You say, 'You will become free'?"**

³⁴ Jesus answered them, "Truly, truly, I say to you, **everyone** who commits sin is the slave of sin.

Jesus did not come to fulfill your lesser needs and desires while leaving your greatest need unmet.

He came in order to free you from your slavery to sin.

³⁶ So **if the Son makes you free, you will be free** indeed.

³³ They answered Him, "We are Abraham's descendants and **have never yet been enslaved to anyone**; how is it that You say, 'You will become free'?" A non-believer does not continue in sin and reject God's authority because they are free...

They do so because they are obeying the authority of another master that owns them – their sin.

Rejecting Christ does not lead to slavery...

It is slavery to the sinful nature that leads to rejecting Christ

⁴³ Why do you not understand what I am saying? It is because you cannot hear My word.

John 8:45

Romans 8:1-4

Therefore there is now no condemnation at all for those who are in Christ Jesus.

² For the law of the Spirit of life in Christ Jesus has set you free from the law of sin and of death. ³ For what the Law could not do, weak as it was through the flesh, God did: sending His own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh and as an offering for sin, He condemned sin in the flesh, ⁴ so that the requirement of the Law might be fulfilled in us who do not walk according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.

Romans 6:1-7

What shall we say then? Are we to continue in sin so that grace may increase?² May it never be! How shall we who died to sin still live in it? ³ Or do you not know that all of us who have been baptized. into Christ Jesus have been baptized into His death? ⁴ Therefore we have been buried with Him through baptism into death, so that as Christ was raised from the dead through the glory of the Father, so we too might walk in newness of life. ⁵ For if we have become united with Him in the likeness of His death, certainly we shall also be in the likeness of His resurrection, ⁶ knowing this, that our old self was crucified with Him, in order that our body of sin might be done away with, so that we would no longer be slaves to sin; ⁷ for he who has died is freed from sin.
