John 15:26-27

"When the Helper comes,
whom I will send to you from the Father,
that is the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father,
He will testify about Me, and you will testify also,
because you have been with Me from the beginning."

John 16:1-4

"These things I have spoken to you so that you may be kept from stumbling. They will make you outcasts from the synagogue, but an hour is coming for everyone who kills you to think that he is offering service to God. And He, when He comes, will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment; concerning sin, because they do not believe in Me; and concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father and you no longer see Me; and concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world has been judged.

John 16:12-15

"I have many more things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. But when He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all the truth; for He will not speak on His own initiative, but whatever He hears, He will speak; and He will disclose to you what is to come. He will glorify Me, for He will take of Mine and will disclose it to you. All things that the Father has are Mine; therefore I said that He takes of Mine and will disclose it to you."

Main Idea

To our incalculable advantage, Jesus departed this world by way of the cross, ascended to the Father, and sent the Holy Spirit into the world to glorify Christ by testifying to His word and works.

To Our Incalculable Advantage

Why is it to our incalculable advantage that Jesus departed this world?

Why was Christ's departure advantageous? Because His death was necessary for our redemption.

Jesus was speaking of His impending death.

Had Christ not departed by way of the cross, there would be no hope at all for usno redemption, no lasting life.

Mark 8:31

And He began to teach them that **the Son of Man must suffer** many things and be rejected
by the elders and the chief priests and the scribes, **and be killed**, and after three days rise again.

Luke 24:25-26

He said to them, "O foolish men and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken!

Was it not necessary for the Christ to suffer these things and to enter into His glory?"

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Why was Christ's departure advantageous?

Because His death was necessary for our redemption.

Because He went to His Father.

John 16:8 and 10

"And [the Holy Spirit]...will reprove the world... concerning righteousness, that I go to the Father."

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John 16:8 and 10

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Jesus' return to the Father was proof that He had accomplished His work and vindication of His righteousness; it was an entering into His glory.

Hebrews 1:3

When He had made purification of sins, He sat down at the right hand of the Majesty on high.

Jesus accomplished His work, ascended to the Father, and took His place of authority at the Father's right Hand having been restored to His pre-incarnate glory.

John 17:4-5

"I glorified You on the earth, having accomplished the work which You have given Me to do.

Now, Father, glorify Me together with Yourself, with the glory which I had with You before the world was."

Philippians 2:8-11

Being found in appearance as a man,
He humbled Himself by becoming obedient
to the point of death, even death on a cross.

For this reason also, God highly exalted Him,
and bestowed on Him the name
which is above every name.

The Holy Spirit was sent to testify to and apply the finished work of the glorified Lord of lords and King of kings.

Matthew 28:18

And Jesus came up and spoke to them, saying, "All authority has been given to Me in heaven and on earth."

The authority given to the Son included the authority to send the Holy Spirit into the world.

John 7:39

...for the Spirit was not yet given, because Jesus was not yet glorified.

Why was Christ's departure advantageous?

Because His death was necessary for our redemption.

Because He went to His Father.

Because He sent the Spirit.

John 15:26

"When the Helper comes, whom I will send to you from the Father, that is the Spirit of truth who proceeds from the Father, He will testify about Me."

Why is the Holy Spirit needed?

Because the task set before the church is impossible without Him.

"Truly, truly, I say to you, he who believes in Me, the works that I do, he will do also; and greater works than these he will do; because I go to the Father."

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These greater works are made possible only because Jesus went to the Father and sent the Holy Spirit.

The task is simply too big!

John 17:18

"As You sent Me into the world, I also have sent them into the world."

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John 17:18

"As You sent Me into the world,

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Matthew 28:19

"Go therefore and make disciples

of all the nations."

Consider that Jesus, in His humanity, was localized in His ministry; but the Spirit is not only in every believer empowering him but is Himself omnipresent!

The task is simply too dangerous!

John 16:1-4

"These things I have spoken to you so that you may be kept from stumbling. They will make you outcasts from the synagogue, but an hour is coming for everyone who kills you to think that he is offering service to God.

The Holy Spirit was needed to empower the disciples to accomplish an impossible mission and to protect the disciples from stumbling when the mission gets dicey.

Why is the Holy Spirit needed?

Because the task set before the church is impossible without Him.

Because God cannot be known apart from Him.

John 1:10

He was in the world, and the world was made through Him, and the world did not know Him."

John 15:21

"But all these things they will do to you for My name's sake, because they do not know the One who sent Me."

John 16:3

"These things they will do **because**they have not known the Father or Me."

1 Corinthians 2:14

But a natural man does not accept the things of the Spirit of God, for they are foolishness to him; and **he cannot understand them**, because they are spiritually appraised.

1 Corinthians 2:12

Now we have received, not the spirit of the world, but the Spirit who is from God, so that we may know the things freely given to us by God.

The Holy Spirit is needed because, apart from Him, *no one* will know God and His Son, Jesus Christ.

What is the mission of the Spirit?

To glorify Christ by guiding the Apostles into all the truth.

"I have many more things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. But when He, the Spirit of truth, comes, He will guide you into all the truth; for He will not speak on His own initiative, but whatever He hears, He will speak; and He will disclose to you what is to come.

He will glorify Me, for He will take of Mine and will disclose it to you."

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The mission of the Holy Spirit was to glorify Christ by guiding the Apostles into all the truth and inspiring them to write His very words to us.

Remember what Jesus had told them...

John 14:26

"But the Helper, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in My name, He will teach you all things, and bring to your remembrance all that I said to you."

2 Peter 1:21

"...no prophecy was ever made by an act of human will, but men moved by the Holy Spirit spoke from God."

What is the mission of the Spirit?

To glorify Christ by guiding the Apostles into all the truth.

To glorify Christ by testifying to His words and works.

John 15:26

"When the Helper comes,

This testimony is not merely a matter of making true statements but a matter of making Christ known so as to further Christ's interests.

The mission of the Holy Spirit is to *apply* all that Christ has said and done *to us*.

The Spirit's work on behalf of Christ...

He enlivens us.

He indwells us.

He seals us.

He assures us.

He leads us.

He intercedes for us.

He bears fruit in and through us.

What is the mission of the Spirit?

To glorify Christ by guiding the Apostles into all the truth.

To glorify Christ by testifying to His words and works.

To glorify Christ by reproving the world.

"And He, when He comes, will convict the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment; concerning sin, because they do not believe in Me; and concerning righteousness, because I go to the Father and you no longer see Me; and concerning judgment, because the ruler of this world has been judged."

"And He, when He comes, will **reprove** the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment; concerning sin, **that** they do not believe in Me; and concerning righteousness, **that** I go to the Father and you no longer see Me; and concerning judgment, that the ruler of this world has been judged."

This "conviction" is not referring to the subjective work of the Spirit to impress upon the soul its need of Christ; rather, it refers to the Spirit's reproof of the world concerning its *objective* guilt.

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concerning sin, that they do not believe in Me

and concerning righteousness, that I go to the Father and you no longer see Me; and concerning judgment, that the ruler of this world has been judged."

The issue is not simply "sins"; it is rejection of God Himself as revealed in His Son.

The world rejected Jesus and crucified Him, but the Father, in vindication of Jesus' righteousness, received Him and glorified Him.

"And He, when He comes, will reprove the world concerning sin and righteousness and judgment; concerning sin, that they do not believe in Me; and concerning righteousness, that I go to the Father

and you no longer see Me; and concerning judgment,
that the ruler of this world has been judged."

If the ruler of this world ruler has been judged, what will become of his followers?

Consider that the very presence of the Holy Spirit is an indictment of a world that rejected Christ and sought to cast Him out.

Conclusion

Ponder the advantages of Jesus' departure from this world.

Remember that you have been given the Holy Spirit to empower you for a mission.
