The Holy Spirit is the empowerer for life in Christ Jesus by His Word. Jesus had promised the gift of His Spirit, and His command that they receive Him looked forward to the fullness of this gift at Pentecost.

The power they received is primarily the power of the gospel message made clear to them by the Spirit.
