Major Themes

• There is an essential connection between sound doctrine and sound living.

Biblical truths should be visible truths in the lives of God's people.

Major Themes

• There is an essential connection between the grace of God that has saved us, our godly living in the present, and our future glory.

The grace of God is His undeserved favor toward us. This favor is manifestly seen in the way that God saves us on account of Christ, and in the way that favor extends to practical help in our lives.

A Purposeful Preamble

Titus 1:1-4

Main Idea

The authority of the Word, the hope of eternal life, and our confidence for obedience are all grounded in the faithfulness of God.

Titus 1:1-4

By calling himself a "servant of God", Paul was demonstrating that he was constrained to do the will of God, and that he also had the authority to speak on behalf of God.

By calling himself "an apostle of Jesus Christ", Paul claims that he holds a specific and authoritative office whereby he has been commissioned to communicate and minister the infallible word of God.

Servant of God & Apostle of Jesus Christ

"I belong to God the Father, in order to do His will, and I have been sent by Jesus Christ, in order to deliver His word."

⁴ To Titus, my true child **in a common faith**...

Paul deliberately confers authority on Titus by establishing that he is a genuine convert who shares the faith of the elect.

This contrasts with the false teachers that Titus was commissioned to refute.

Christ commissioned Paul to speak God's word for Him to His people.

Paul wrote God's word to Titus and commissioned Titus to speak God's word to the Cretans.

When Titus teaches the content of this letter to the Cretans, he is teaching God's own words to them.

If we obey Titus as he teaches these things, we are obeying Paul.

If we are obeying what Paul wrote, we are obeying The Lord.

Therefore, if we obey Titus as he applies what Paul wrote, we obey the Lord.

If we reject Titus' teaching and application of this letter, we are rejecting Titus, Paul, and the Lord.

Since the scriptures we have are the very words of God, they come to us with an authority that places a moral obligation on us to understand and obey what they say.

¹ Paul, a servant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ, for the sake of **the faith of God's elect** and **the knowledge of the truth, which accords** "For the sake of the faith of the elect of God, *that is*, the knowledge of the truth which is according to godliness."

The "faith of the elect of God" comprises:

1. The acknowledgment of the truth

2. A response to that truth of godliness

"godliness" (eusebeia) = devotion, piety

The "faith of the elect of God" involves an inner response to the truth, which shows itself in pious devotion to God.

Paul can have confidence in the authority of his ministry of the Word because God is faithful to His eternal promise and plan.

Likewise, we can have confidence to preach and minister the Word because God is still faithful to His eternal promise and plan.
