Main Idea

Because the church will face the threat of false teachers and corrupt doctrine, we must be committed to persistently promoting the truth and aggressively refuting corrupt doctrine.

The overseer must be...⁹ holding fast the faithful word which is in accordance with the teaching, so that he will be able both to exhort in sound doctrine and to refute those who contradict.

¹⁰ For there are many rebellious men, empty talkers and deceivers, especially those of the circumcision, ¹¹ who must be silenced because they are upsetting whole families, teaching things they should not teach for the sake of sordid gain.

Biblically qualified teachers are committed to the authority and sufficiency of Scripture, and they labor to submit themselves and their teaching to it.

False teachers characteristically deny that the bible is the only authoritative standard of faith and practice. They function under their own authority.

Sound doctrine is profitable for God's people because it conforms them to the revealed will of God.

Corrupt doctrine is not profitable because it fails to conform us to the revealed will of God, making it empty of value.

¹¹ ...teaching things they should not teach **for the sake of sordid gain.**

The qualified elder is not self-interested and not fond of sordid gain, keeping him free to hold fast to the Word, regardless of popular opinion.

The false teacher is selfishly motivated and bound to compromise sound doctrine in an effort to appeal to popular opinion.

The reputation of the Cretans was an accurate stereotype for these false teachers.
