



Main Point

In Paul's simple salutation, he sets the stage for his instruction by reminding the Thessalonians of the foundation he laid when with them - a foundation that is thoroughly theological.

Paul's Trinitarian teaching and his application of covenantal realities to the Gentiles is likely what drove the anger of the Jews.



Paul changed the form of the standard greeting, thus converting a common convention of his day into a blessing with rich theologically significance.

Grace is our only hope!

Grace is the reality that governs our relationship with God... but it must also govern our relationships with one another.

Paul's Theological Blessing

Grounded in grace.

Pointed at peace.

1 Thessalonians 1:1-4 Grace to you and peace.

Grace to you and peace.

It is God's grace that brings peace!

John 14:27

Peace I leave with you; My peace I give to you; not as the world gives do I give to you. Do not let your heart be troubled, nor let it be fearful.

Romans 5:1

Therefore, having been justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

2 Corinthians 13:11

Finally, brethren, rejoice, be made complete, be comforted, be like-minded, live in peace; and the God of love and peace will be with you.

When you live in grace you will experience the peace of God, and when you live by grace you will be at peace with others.
