Christ's second coming is the final consummation and involves the resurrection "of both the righteous and the wicked" (Acts 24:15) and the final judgment (John 5:29).


Big Picture Overview




Most AMs believe that the company of the elect is vast and that the gospel will be preached throughout the world, but they also believe that the wicked are many and will remain in hostile opposition until the end of the age.




AMs do not interpret the Bible "literally" but allegorically, they posit a "replacement theology" of Israel, they inadvertently promote antisemitism, and their system is rooted in Platonism.



If Revelation 20 chronologically follows chapter 19, amillennialism cannot be true; and there is no good reason to believe that there is a break between chapters 19 and 20.



Many passages indicate an age of great righteousness, peace, and prosperity on the earth (Isaiah 2, 11, 65; Dan. 2:35; 7:9-14, etc.); and amillennialism does not fully account for these things.



Isaiah 65:20 says that there will be death in the new heavens and new earth, so this cannot refer to the eternal state but must refer to an earthly age of righteousness, peace, and prosperity.
