Paul's prayer teaches that all our plans and movements, even those aimed at fulfilling our mission to Christ, are subject to the will of God.

James 4:13-15

Come now, you who say, "Today or tomorrow we will go to such and such a city, and spend a year there and engage in business and make a profit."

Instead, you ought to say, "If the Lord wills, we will live and also do this or that."

Paul frequently interchanges the Father and the Son in ways that demonstrate his assumption of essential unity.

Doctrinal Clarity:

The Father and the Son are the same in substance but different in person.

God has one nature but is three Persons: Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Conversely, Jesus is one Person but with two natures, being both God and man.

Doctrinal Clarity:

The Son of God, the second Person in the Holy Trinity, being very and eternal God, the brightness of the Father's glory, of one substance and equal with him... Two whole, perfect, and distinct natures, were inseparably joined together in one Person: without conversion, composition, or confusion: which Person is very God, and very Man.

God's sovereignty cannot be disconnected from His sanctioning authority.

Paul recognized that his desire to minister was subject to Jesus' authorization, that is, His calling.

A calling that is sure...

We have been sanctioned by our Lord to call all peoples into relationship to Him as their Master, turning them away from serving idols to serve the true and living God by faith.

The phrase before God refers to the place of judgment, before the tribunal of God.

Romans 4:2

For if Abraham was justified by works, he has something to boast about, but not **before God**.

1 Corinthians 1:29

...so that no man may boast before God.

in holiness before our God and Father at the coming of our Lord Jesus with all His saints.

There *is* a coming judgment, and this judgment will be at Jesus' coming.

Paul's prayer reminds us that nothing could be more consequential than to be brought before the judgment seat of the holy, holy, holy God.
