Main Point

It is an action noun referring to the *activity* of separating or dedicating for sacred use.

"Renouncing the world, and clearing ourselves from the pollutions of the flesh, we offer ourselves to God as if in sacrifice, for nothing can with propriety be offered to Him, but what is pure and holy." (John Calvin)

God's Will: Separated Holiness

The desire to please God is the strongest and best motivation, and this is implied by Paul in his admonition to the Roman church.

Romans 12:1

Therefore I urge you, brethren, by the mercies of God, to present your bodies a living and holy sacrifice, acceptable to God, which is your spiritual service of worship.

A begrudging sacrifice would not be an acceptable or pleasing sacrifice to God.

1 Timothy 1:5 But the goal of our instruction is love from a pure heart and a good conscience and a sincere faith.

Separated Holiness

Why focus on sexual purity?

Roman culture was immersed in sexual immorality, to the point that it played a key role in their cultic worship, likely leading to persecution of those *prudish* Christians who refused to participate.

Commands Related to Sexual Purity Abstain from sexual immorality.

Porneia refers to the broad spectrum of sexual immorality that would include any sexual relationship outside of marriage and is the application of the command "you shall not commit adultery."

Hebrews 13:4

Marriage is to be held in honor among all, and the marriage bed is to be undefiled; for fornicators and adulterers God will judge.

We are commanded to separate ourselves from the whole world of sexual immorality, devoting ourselves to purity.

We are commanded to learn how to purify and control our sexual urges and passions. "that each of you know how"

Commands Related to Sexual Purity

What harm is there?

Proverbs 6:32-35

The one who commits adultery with a woman is lacking sense; he who would destroy himself does it. Wounds and disgrace he will find, and his reproach will not be blotted out. For jealousy enrages a man, and he will not spare in the day of vengeance. He will not accept any ransom, nor will he be satisfied though you give many gifts.

"Yes, but..."

Consider:

Human trafficking is a key source for pornography and the sex trades.

Use of pornography and the sex trades fuels human trafficking.

What about consent?

We have been indoctrinated to believe that consent is all that matters; and when there is consent, there is no wrong done to anyone.

This is a lie that denies the spiritual nature of the sexual union, individualizes conduct, and ignores the progressive nature of sin.

Take heed and receive this warning!

Reasons to Keep Ourselves Pure

It is this status that ought to motivate us to pure and holy conduct.

Reasons to Keep Ourselves Pure
