2 Corinthians 5:17-21

- ¹⁷"Therefore if anyone is in Christ, *he is* a new creature; the old things passed away; behold, new things have come.

What is a spiritual stupor?

Definition of Stupor

Meriam-Webster

1. :a condition of greatly dulled or completely suspended sense or feeling; drifted into a pleasant, dreamy stupor.

2. : a state of dullness or lack of interest resulting often from stress or shock.

(Maybe like a "Brain fog" for one reason or another.)



Definition of Stupor: Hebrew

The phrase "spirit of stupor" alludes to Isaiah 29:10. The Hebrew word in the quotation for stupor means numbness resulting from a sting. Stupor is a **deadness** toward God's grace. God rejected Israel corporately, as a nation, because of this. This does not mean He rejected the nation Israel forever.

Israel did not respond to God's offer of salvation by grace because of their stupor. Their persistent stupor rendered torpor—a state resulting from too much sensation. These people were dulled by their constant rejection of God's grace.

Isaiah 30:1-5

Woe to the rebellious children," declares the LORD, "Who execute a plan, but not Mine, And make an alliance, but not of My Spirit, In order to add sin to sin;

² who proceed down to Egypt **Without consulting Me**,
To take refuge in the safety of Pharaoh and to seek shelter in the shadow of Egypt!

³ "Therefore the safety of Pharaoh will be your shame and the shelter in the shadow of Egypt, your humiliation.

⁴ "For their princes are at Zoan and their ambassadors arrive at Hanes.

⁵ "Everyone will be ashamed because of a people **who cannot profit them**, *Who are* not for help or profit, but for **shame and also for reproach**."

Definition of Stupor: Greek

Ac 7:51, "You stiff-necked and uncircumcised in heart and ears! You always resist the Holy Spirit; as your fathers *did*, so *do* you. The Greek carries the idea of cause—"a spirit which causes numbness."

"Do not **grieve** the Holy Spirit of God, by whom you were sealed for the day of redemption." Ephesians 4:30

"Do not quench the Spirit;" 1 Thessalonians 5:19

1 Corinthians 15:33-34

"Do not be deceived: "Bad company corrupts good morals." Become **sober-minded** as you ought, and stop sinning; for **some have no knowledge of God**. I speak *this* to **your shame**."

Luke 21:34-36

"But watch yourselves lest your hearts be weighed down with dissipation and drunkenness and cares of this life, and that day come upon you suddenly like a trap. For it will come upon all who dwell on the face of the whole earth. But stay awake at all times, praying that you may have strength to escape all these things that are going to take place, and to stand before the Son of Man."



The Sufficiency of the Gospel

2 Peter 1:2-4

²"Grace and peace be multiplied to you in **the knowledge of God and of Jesus our Lord**;

³ seeing that His divine power has granted to us **everything** pertaining to life and godliness, through **the true knowledge of Him** who called us by His own glory and excellence.

⁴ For by these He has granted to us His precious and magnificent promises, so that by them you may become partakers of the divine nature, having escaped the corruption that is in the world by lust.

The Sufficiency of the Gospel 2 Peter 1:5-8

⁵ Now for this very reason also, **applying all diligence**, in your faith supply **moral excellence**, and in *your* moral excellence, **knowledge**,

⁶ and in *your* knowledge, **self-control**, and in *your* perseverance, **godliness**,

⁷ and in *your* godliness, **brotherly kindness**, and in *your* brotherly kindness, **love**.

⁸ For if these *qualities* are yours and are increasing, **they render you** neither useless nor unfruitful in the true knowledge **of our Lord Jesus Christ.**

Our Conclusion Based In God's Undeniable Truth

We are fully equipped. But we have a choice about whether or not we'll really use those spiritual tools. This requires effort on our part.

Our Conclusion Based In God's Undeniable Truth

For those in Christ, God's divine power has given us everything we need for life and godliness. Like salvation, all of this was ours when we came to know God (through faith in Christ). As Peter makes clear, **knowing God**, the source of all life, is the only path to being fully equipped to live as God calls us to do.

When we speak of knowing God, it is important to understand that we are not talking about abstract or speculative thought concerning God or mystical experiences but about coming alive to God through Jesus Christ and surrendering ourselves to Him in grateful love (Rom. 12:1). As John says, "Whoever has the Son has life; whoever does not have the Son of God does not have life" (1 John 5:12). Thomas A. Tarrants Author, President Emeritus, CSLI

We must also understand that knowing God is not an optional part of the Christian life; it is the Christian life. Jesus said, "And this is eternal life, that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent" (John 17:3). The English word *know* in this verse is a translation of the Greek word *ginosko*, which, in this context, means an experiential knowing, not simply an intellectual understanding of facts about God or Jesus or the Bible. This relationship begins when we come alive to God -- that is, when, by grace, we are awakened from the state of spiritual death into which everyone is born, and receive the eternal life Jesus offers to those who trust in Him for salvation. The first part, recognizing and turning from our sins, is repentance; the second part, trusting in Jesus and His atoning death on the cross to forgive our sins, is faith. Coming alive to God requires both. Jesus described this as being born from above or born of the Holy Spirit. It means birth into God's family and entrance into His kingdom (John 3:3–8). Without rebirth by the Holy Spirit, a person cannot see, perceive, understand, or know God or His kingdom. Thomas A. Tarrants Author, President Emeritus, CSLI

The metaphor of birth provides a helpful way of understanding fuller implications of what it means to know God and to grow in that relationship. John distinguishes between "little children," "fathers," and "young men" (1 John 2:12–14). What does this mean? Spiritually the newest infant in Christ knows God, but not very well. As this baby grows in grace, he or she will progress toward maturity and, in doing so, will come to know God better and better. We have probably seen this if we have been believers for a while. What a joy it is to encounter an infant in Christ, a new convert, eager and zealous for the things of God. But what a blessing to meet a father or mother in Christ, a mature believer who has faithfully walked with God for decades and whose life is characterized by a degree of love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness, and self-control that is truly Christlike! This kind of mature relationship with God is what every believer is called to pursue. Thomas A. Tarrants Author, President Emeritus, CSLI

Knowing God-what He says.

John 17:3 "And this is eternal life, that they know you, the only true God, and Jesus Christ whom you have sent."
