a. A Brief Review of VVI PALLIN NATURE

The devil is the father of the kingdom of darkness.

We are born into this kingdom of darkness.

We are bound as slaves to sin, we can only serve him and ourselves.

We are void of the good that God provided us at creation.

This is what is natural for the fallen nature.

b. A Brief Review of Our New Life In Christ.

Regeneration (New Birth)

Regeneration is the sovereign work of God whereby the Holy Spirit changes our hearts (nature), and inclines us to repent and believe. In regeneration, God makes us new and applies to us every saving grace in Christ. Regeneration is what happens in the effectual call and is inseparable from the effectual call, which results in a change in nature, faith in Christ, and genuine repentance.

Our New Nature

- The Holy Spirit empowers the new nature to produce Christ-like behavior in us.

- By sharing in Christ's crucifixion, we can now reckon ourselves dead to sin.

Our New Nature

The Holy Spirit leads us in a new way of thinking and change in behavior.

Our New Nature

• The presence of God's glory provides our needs for adequacy, affection, praise, reassurance, security, justification of my value, and eternal significance.

John Pipers' Take On It

(John Piper is not God anymore than I am)

"When the object of our delight is moral beauty, the longing to behold is inseparable from the longing to be. When the Holy Spirit awakens the heart of a person to delight in the holiness of God, an insatiable desire is born not only to behold that holiness, but to be holyas God is holy."

The Conflict

Once a person trusts Christ they now have a new nature.

However the fallen nature is not annihilated. (**God has a good purpose** for it- sanctification.)

Romans 8:28-30

The fallen nature will not leave the believer alone until the Christian

goes to heaven. We are told not to encourage the old nature in any way.

Romans 6:15-18

The Conflict

The believer faces the constant struggle, at any given moment, to serve God or to serve self.

Romans 6:16; Galatians 5:17

Spurgeon States the Conflict of the Two Natures This Way:

"When we are born again there is dropped into our soul the living and incorruptible seed of the word of God, which lives and abides for ever..."



"It has no tendency to sin, but all its appetites are heavenward and Christward... It is at deadly enemey with the fallen nature, which it will in the end destroy;"



"but, as I have said before, it has its work to do, and it is a work which, assisted even by divine strength, will not be accomplished all at once. It is a warfare which, when it seems ended, starts up again without notice, since, after long and victorious campaigns, the routed enemy returns to the field."

The Battle Strategy To Begin, Test the Spirits

1 John 4:1-3

"Beloved, do not believe every spirit, but test the spirits to see whether they are from God, because many false prophets have gone out into the world. By this you know the Spirit of God: every spirit that confesses that Jesus Christ has come in the flesh is from God; ³ and every spirit that does not confess Jesus is not from God; this is the *spirit* of the antichrist, of which you have heard that it is coming, and now it is already in the world."

Test Every spirit for What?

The Acid Test

Are they preaching Jesus or Jesus plus?

The core of the message must be void of any thing but

Jesus' sufficiency to save, transform, and glorify us.

The Key Piece of Evidence of a False Teacher:

They will persuasively bring in some form of self-worship as a necessary component. It will be emotionally based, not a work of the Holy Spirit.

This is the very chain of bondage to sin that the Father of our adoption has broken for us with the giving of His Son to pay our penalty for choosing self-worship over worshiping Him.

What is This Stuff? Traditions of Men

"The Jews governed themselves by the traditions of their elders and the rudiments or elements of the world, the rites and observances which were only preparatory and introductory to the gospel state.

The Gentiles mixed their maxims of philosophy with their Christian principles; and both have alienated their minds from Christ.

Those who pin their faith on other men's sleeves, and walk in the way of the world, have turned away from following after Christ." -Matthew Henry

A Short List of Worldly Philosophy and Traditions of Men

This an exercise for you to follow through on.

Hint: Look for those deceptions that bring into question or negate God's authority and put the focus on some form of building self-confidence on the deception "I am God." It will contain things that are only true of God that are impossible for us.

The Necessity of Being Rooted in the Word

2 Corinthians 11:13-14

"For such men are false apostles, deceitful workers, disguising themselves as apostles of Christ. No wonder, for even Satan disguises himself as an angel of light."

The Necessity of Being Rooted in the Word

Colossians 2:6-7

"Therefore, as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him,

...having been firmly rooted and *now* being built up in Him and established in your faith, just as you were instructed, *and* overflowing with gratitude."

Being firmly rooted in The Gospel is one aspect of how the Father of our adoption keeps us from the dangers of the spiritual battle.

The Battle Strategy 2 Corinthians 10:3-5

"For though we walk in the flesh, we do not war according to the flesh, ⁴ for the weapons of our warfare are not of the flesh, but divinely powerful for the destruction of fortresses. ⁵ We are destroying speculations and every lofty thing raised up against the knowledge of God, and we are taking every thought captive to the obedience of Christ..."

Remember James 4:4 "Therefore whoever wants to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God."

In short it is the turning back to the culture of the kingdom of darkness and submitting ourselves to its rule and solutions that our heavenly Father has released us from.

How Did They Become Dull of Hearing?

"See to it that there is no one who takes you captive through philosophy and empty deception in accordance with human tradition, in accordance with the elementary principles of the world, rather than in accordance with Christ."

Therefore, as you have received Christ Jesus the Lord, so walk in Him,"

What Was Going On There?

• They were under pressure to conform to the culture of darkness that surrounded them.

 They were giving in to the fear of man and compromising Sound Doctrine.

• They were no longer walking by faith because they had cut themselves off of the meat of the Word that builds faith.

What Was Going On There?

• They began wavering and compromising by integrating the practices of the deceptive philosophy that were in accordance with human tradition, in accordance with the elementary principles of the world.

• By letting go of Sound Doctrine they became unstable, they lacked assurance, they gave up the glory of regeneration.

 At this point the adopted child has literally left the presence of the glory of their Father and returned to the fallen nature and the surroundings of it.

What Can be Done about It?

At this point the best offense is to retreat with a godly sorrow to the

safety and refreshment of the Father, Who adopted us, can provide.

Then confess and repent of not trusting Him to keep the promises of

His covenant.
