Main Point

Jeremiah was called by God to pronounce judgment upon Judah at a time that made this work dangerous to himself and required him to gird himself up with great courage and faith, setting an example for us to follow.

The destruction of warfare. The exile of the people. Jeremiah's message was "Surrender or suffer!"

Jeremiah 32:35

"They built the high places of Baal that are in the valley of Ben-hinnom to cause their sons and their daughters to pass through the fire to Molech, which I had not commanded them nor had it entered My mind that they should do this abomination, to cause Judah to sin."

What is the rationale behind child sacrifice, and how does this relate to us?

Consider what the LORD says to Jeremiah

Jeremiah's Calling

Called to pronounce judgment. He was called to provide hope.

The hope proclaimed by Jeremiah was fulfilled and secured by Christ in His death and resurrection and is the foundation of our hope and joy now.

Opposition from his homeland

Jeremiah 11:21-23

"Therefore thus says the LORD concerning the men of Anathoth, who seek your life, saying, "Do not prophesy in the name of the LORD, so that you will not die at our hand"; therefore, thus says the LORD of hosts, "Behold, I am about to punish them! The young men will die by the sword, their sons and daughters will die by famine; and a remnant will not be left to them, for I will bring disaster on the men of Anathoth the year of their punishment."

Opposition from his own family

Jeremiah 12:6 "For even your brothers and the household of your father, Even they have dealt treacherously with you, Even they have cried aloud after you. Do not believe them, although they may say nice things to you."

Jeremiah's Conflict

Jeremiah 1:17 "Now, gird up your loins and arise, and speak to them all which I command you. Do not be dismayed before them, or I will dismay you before them." The LORD knew the temptation Jeremiah would face to turn away from his calling, so He forewarned him to prepare and strengthen him.

Jeremiah's conflict within

Jeremiah 20:7-8

"O LORD, You have deceived me and I was deceived; You have overcome me and prevailed. I have become a laughingstock all day long; Everyone mocks me. For each time I speak, I cry aloud; I proclaim violence and destruction, Because for me the word of the LORD has resulted In reproach and derision all day long."

Jeremiah's conflict within

Jeremiah 20:9-10 "But if I say, "I will not remember Him Or speak anymore in His name," Then in my heart it becomes like a burning fire Shut up in my bones; and I am weary of holding it in, And I cannot endure it. For I have heard the whispering of many, "Terror on every side! Denounce him; yes, let us denounce him!" All my trusted friends, watching for my fall, say: "Perhaps he will be deceived, so that we may prevail against him and take our revenge on him."

Despite all these conflicts, Jeremiah girded himself up and courageously obeyed God and spoke all the words given to him.
