An Exposition of the 2nd (1689) London Baptist Confession Chapter 12.1: Of Adoption

12.1 All those that are justified, God conferred, in and for the sake of his only Son Jesus Christ, to make partakers of the grace of adoption,^a by which they are taken into the number, and enjoy the liberties and privileges of the children of God,^b have his name put on them,^c receive the spirit of adoption,^d have access to the throne of grace with boldness, are enabled to cry Abba, Father,^e are pitied,^f protected,^g provided for,^h and chastened by him as by a Father,ⁱ yet never cast off,^j but sealed to the day of redemption,^k and inherit the promises as heirs of everlasting salvation.¹

1. The recipients of adoption.

- a. All those that are *justified* (Galatians 4:4-5).
- b. **All** those that are justified (Romans 8:29-30).
- 2. The author of adoption (Ephesians 1:5; Romans 8:23).
 - a. God, the sovereign, conferred to make partakers of the grace of adoption.
 - b. God, the Father, conferred to make partakers of the *grace of adoption*.

3. The mediator of adoption.

- a. In His only Son Jesus Christ (Ephesians 1:5-6).
- b. *For the sake of* His only Son Jesus Christ (Isaiah 53:10; Ephesians 1:18; 5:32).

- 4. The blessings of adoption.
 - a. We are taken into the number as children (John 1:12).
 - b. We enjoy the liberties and privileges of the children of God (2 Corinthians 6:18).
 - i. We have His name put upon us (Revelation 3:12).
 - ii. We receive the spirit of adoption (Romans 8:15).
 - iii. We have access to the throne of grace with boldness (Ephesians 3:12; Hebrews 4:16).
 - iv. We are enabled to cry Abba, Father (Romans 8:15).
 - c. We are cared for as children.
 - i. We are pitied as by a Father (Psalm 103:13).
 - ii. We are protected as by a Father (Proverbs 14:26).
 - iii. We are provided for as by a Father (1 Peter 5:7).
 - iv. We are chastened as by a Father (Hebrews 12:6).
 - d. We are never cast off, but sealed to the day of redemption (Lamentations 3:31; Ephesians 4:30).
 - e. We inherit the promises as heirs of everlasting salvation (Hebrews 1:14; 6:12; 2 Corinthians 1:20).
