# Offices of the Church: Elders

- 1. The Work of Elders
  - a. Terms used
    - i. "Elder" =  $\pi\rho\epsilon\sigma\beta$ ύτερος (presbuteros)
    - ii. "Overseer" [Bishop] =  $\dot{\epsilon}$ πίσκοπος, (episkopos)
  - b. Essential responsibilities

- 2. The Qualifications for Elders
  - 1 Timothy 3:1-7 Titus 1:5-9 1 Peter 5:1-3
  - a. Aspiration/desire/not under compulsion/calling
  - b. Affirmed by the church (Agreement with calling)
  - c. Above reproach
  - d. One woman man
  - e. Temperate
  - f. Prudent/Self-controlled
  - g. Respectable
  - h. Hospitable
  - i. Able to teach

Able to discern between truth and false teaching and able to give a defense of the doctrines of the church against such.

j. Not given to drunkenness

- k. Not violent
- I. Gentle
- m. Not quarrelsome
- n. Not a lover of money
- o. Manages his household well
- p. Children are under control

"Faithful" children (cf. Titus 1:6)

Children that are not incorrigible, rebellious, or reckless

- q. Not immature in the faith
- r. A good reputation outside the church
- s. Not self-willed
- t. Not quick tempered
- u. Loves what is good
- v. Just and upright
- w. Devout
- x. Disciplined

#### 3. The Number of Elders

"Elders" is always plural unless the context demands a singular noun.
Acts 14:23; 15:2; 20:17 (note that "church" is singular)
1 Timothy 5:17 (note that v 19 demands a singular)
Titus 1:5 (note that "city" is singular)
James 5:14 (note that "church" is singular)
1 Peter 5:1 (note the exceptional use of the singular)
